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This points to a compelling evidence of our role as a discipleship school, something which we strive to maintain and enhance. We're regularly asking the question "does 'how' we do school allow us to disciple students"?

We're wanting to portray the Christian faith not as a protection from an evil, dangerous world but we're wanting to model and coach a Christian faith that has meaning and application, mission and purpose in every field of endeavour. A Christian faith that patterns and renews the things of this world; not a faith that puts us in another world entirely.

Dan Egeler, the President of ACSI argues that too many parents regard choosing between Christian schooling or secular schooling in the same way as they regard choosing between bottled water or tap water. "Water may be water, but education is not education" says Dr. Egeler.

"Recognizing what the Lord may have for your family is critical to children not being blown around like a feather in the wind. You, as a parent, must point the fan. Choosing your education is like choosing your spouse. You don't choose your spouse because of convenience. You choose your spouse out of mission and purpose. My challenge to you is that your children's education is no different."
