Executive Functioning Skills:

N perspective from Vivienne Schoonwinkel, [Senior Teacher serving on the Academic Advisory Committee]

One of the goals we have here at The King's School West Rand is to teach our children **executive functioning skills**. These are the mental processes that enable us to plan, focus attention, remember instructions and juggle multiple tasks successfully. The brain needs these skills to filter distractions and irrelevant stimulation, prioritize tasks, set and achieve goals, and control impulses, so that a relevant task can successfully be completed.

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At our school, we group the executive functioning skills together under **5 main headings.** These include organising, not delaying, prioritising, listening actively and staying on task. We offer visual and tangible reminders of these in each class.

There are many reasons why we are excited about this. Proven positive outcomes include: Better academic performance; learning to balance social activities with academic demands; effective problem-solving skills; better reading and comprehension; more satisfying interactions with peers; better intrinsic motivation; higher levels of perceived competence; self-efficacy; improved moral and moral conduct; cognition fewer behaviour problems; less chance of depression.

Some sources go as far as to state that it separates successful students from the failures! Good executive-function skills are not a quarantee of school success. but their absence is a predictor of difficulty at some point, and of the loss of self-esteem that follows. We strongly believe that we need to help our children early on to develop these skills, so they can succeed in school and life. Investing time and effort into training our students in executive function returns lifelong benefits for our students, enables positive behaviour and allows them to make healthy choices - now and later in life, because it governs their ability to evaluate their **own** work and behaviour in real time.

The final outcome for The King's School is a better educated member of society, capable

of meeting the challenges of our time to fulfil their God-given purpose.
