CELL PHONE

A San Diego State University professor is surprised to read that someone might sleep with their cell phone and decides to ask his first year students what they do with their phones at night. To his surprise, all of them sleep with their phone, most in bed or under the pillow, but at least within arm's length of the bed.

Psychologists conclude that we are certifiably addicted to our cell phones and teens spend on average a full working day on their phone every day.

In South Korea gamers are buying adult nappies so that they are not interrupted by bodily functions during their digital activity.

Researchers warn of an unprecedented medical health crisis that is looming due to depression and loneliness associated with cell phone usage habits.

As an educationist, I hear parents (confession: myself included) saying we know our kids are getting too much screen time, but we are resigned to it.

But as more and more research floods in about the damage being done to our kids by digital addiction, I'm saying, surely we can't be resigned to this phenomenon. Here are my meager offerings for household rules: (would you like to add some suggestions?)

1. NO (ELL PHONES IN BEDROOMS. Use them in living rooms, and charge them away from the bedroom.

2. DAILY DEAD SCREEN TIMES. Not cell phones put away, but cell phones put OFF between certain times. OFF, not on silent. 3. FAVOUR VOICE (ALLS OVER TEXTING. This helps kids to engage in meaningful social interaction over a sustained period rather than dipping in and out of superficial contributions that are humorous, sarcastic or dissing.

4. SWITCH OFF AS MANY NOTIFICATIONS as possible to avoid distractions.

5. BE INTENTIONAL ABOUT FAMILY ACTIVITIES minus screen time.

6. [IIII] (Fear of missing out) is huge and it is just fueled by constant checking of the phone. I know a young person who has regular get-togethers with friends who has a shoe-box at the front door for guests to check in their phones. They are only retrieved when the guest leaves.

7. TRY SOME NON-DIGITAL ALTERNATIVES, even if

only now and then. Read a newspaper or magazine instead of checking News24, write a hand-written note instead of texting (most people we text are people we see every day), do a puzzle or crossword rather than online gaming, experience a live show rather than surfing the net...

Let's not ignore the problem, parents. Our kids are worth fighting for.


