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Understanding the importance of mastering necessary work skills for a changing world can be a daunting exercise for students and parents alike. As parents we need to remember that our role is to guide them and not do it for them. Students need to take **ownership** for their learning/schooling, future and all subsequent choices. Guiding them in how to make these choices is equally important as the choices themselves.

Fortunately we have wonderful processes in the school programme to assist them in mastering the necessary work skills. The real challenge is to reinforce learning at home, to promote dialogue communication between student and parent.

Parents and children need to talk and listen to one another.

Considering their personality, associated strengths, interests, talents, passion etc. all form part of peeking into their future so as to allow them to **reason backwards** to now. So the real question is: "Where do you want to be or go and how will you get there?"

Interests can easily be overlooked or downplayed, but actually are of great importance. "For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases Him." (Php 2:13 NLT). Paul reminds us that God does not push or pressurise us into His plan, but He rather invites us into it by setting up desires in our hearts. Therefore, "What do you want to do?" becomes a significant question.

Pursuing a career or future that you are not really interested in makes no sense and will negatively impact the effort that you are willing to invest in it.

Ability is another area to consider. "What can you do well?" is the associated question. In answering this we need to consider Academics and Reports, but what is the value of a mark? Is a 70% good or bad? Before we can really decide, we need to know what they were aiming for. "What are your goals for your various subjects?" stimulates a much needed conversation between parents and students.

Work ethic is part of ability and needs to be addressed when speaking about marks. The questions to consider is "How hard are you working for this mark?" Scaling the answer from 1-10 can be very helpful so as to indicate whether more effort will get them there or whether another solution needs to be considered.

So develop your skills through dialogue, ownership, and a good work ethic – you are a work in progress and God is not finished with you yet.


