#### From the Principal's Desk...

In the last week of the third term, the Constitutional Court ruled that cannabis would be legalized in South Africa, the third nation in Africa to do so. Some of our senior students expressed the opinion that this was a progressive judgment that should be applauded. That it was a victory that had been a long time in coming.

Perhaps they see it as a victory for their generation against the out-of-touch older generation who spoil their fun, perhaps a victory for 'freedom', whatever that might mean, or perhaps a victory for common sense, because "everyone knows that marijuana is not a stepping stone drug and is generally harmless".

Personally, as an educationist working with young people, I am deeply disappointed by this ruling. I have seen too many young lives ruined by marijuana. Even the Concourt judges conceded that they "do not, of course, intend to minimise the fact that the use of dagga is a great social evil in South Africa".

While people argue that dagga is not addictive and a stepping stone to harder drugs, they do not consider that what might be physiologically non-addictive might well still be psychologically addictive. Worldwide crime stats indicate that there is an undeniable correlation between violent crime and marijuana usage. Advocates of marijuana usage point out that there is no evidence of causal relationship, in other words, it is not known whether dagga causes the criminal behavior or whether it is a case that such criminals just habitually smoke marijuana. Either way, in my opinion, the correlation itself is a warning signal.

But the biggest reason why this ruling makes me so upset, is my small sample of young men and women that have habitually used this substance. Without even one exception in this sample, I have seen that this drug has been progressively destructive to the user, harmed relationships with his closest loved ones and led to downward spiraling of academic performance.

At The King's School West Rand, it remains a breach of our code of conduct and potential expulsion offence to be tested positive for dagga, not because we are fun-spoilers, but because we will fight for kids to have healthy and happy futures.


### GOMA AND HEF OUTREACH


Congratulations to Connor and Andrew Beijl who took part in a Tennis Tournament during the school holidays. Connor came 3rd and Andrew won the tournament.
