As we come to the end of the term, we give thanks for all of God's provisions and for his goodness to us. The opening of our swimming pool complex, the school camp, the growth of our children - all marks of God's bountiful provision.

I would encourage parents during the holidays, to reinforce the patterns we are striving to develop in our students at school. Executive function.

1. Initiation skills - getting started without procrastinating. Kids should have chores to complete at home (even within the leisure time they must enjoy!) and not leave things until they become a source of conflict with parents.

2. Organisation skills - even while kids have more of their 'own time' during holidays, they should not just 'vegetate' in front of a screen. They can be expected to organise their day, organise their room and plan a variety of outdoor activities for themselves.

3. Prioritisation - all of us are slaves to the 'tyranny of the urgent' and this often means we neglect the important. Important things that can be neglected in the holidays because of pressing distractions can be

quiet times (scripture reading and prayer), exercise and serving in our communities.

4. Listening actively - Eugene Peterson coined this beautiful concept of 'responsive obedience' - absorbing and understanding something and then actively finding ways of responding to it in a redemptive way.

5. Staying on task - a big learning curve for every student is to finish strong, never leaving things undone or working on something sporadically and haphazardly. Even at home, tasks must be done and completed within a reasonable schedule.

All of the above are skills that must be learnt and mastered for all of life, not just school work. That's why we need to reinforce the application of executive function in all of life - schoolwork, family life, training for a sport or at gym, community work and holiday routines.

May your holiday be full of joy in the presence of God.


GRAND OPENING OF OUR POOLA DREAM COME TRUE!




