From the Principal's desk

Self-regulated not other-regulated

At The King's School West Rand, we believe that it is important to train students to be self-regulated rather than other-regulated. We live in a world characterised by anxious, hyper-vigilant parenting, where children are quickly 'rescued' from any demanding situation and then miss out on developing emotional resilience or brave perseverance. And so they remain helpless and dependent, and are slow to develop a level of autonomy expected of their age.

To assist, we constantly teach and reinforce 5 self-regulation or executive function skills at our school:

- **Initiating** (starting a task without prompting from an authority figure)
- **Self-organisation** (arranging own programme, desk or materials)
- **Prioritising** (being able to sequence tasks in order of importance)
- **Listening actively** (listen with intent to action), and

• **Staying on task** (persevering until completion)

Parents, let's encourage our kids to engage in 'responsible risk-taking' so that they can slowly begin to develop self-regulation. I know that it's bucking the trend of modern parenting. Stanford University undergraduate dean Julie Lythcott-Haims broaches the issue in her new book, *How to Raise an Adult*:

"Why did parenting change from preparing our kids for life to protecting them from life, which means they're not prepared to live life on their own?" she writes. "We treat our kids like rare and precious botanical specimens. . . Without experiencing the rougher spots of life, our kids become exquisite, like orchids, yet are incapable, sometimes terribly incapable, of thriving in the real world on their own."
