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# From the Chairman

## DEAR PARENTS

With the end of 2021 fast approaching, we reflect on another year where it has been challenging to plan and where we have had to be innovative and flexible as a school with our program. Mr Langley and the staff have seen us through these challenges with grace and determination and on behalf of the Board of Directors, I would like to say a very big thank you for all their hard work and dedication. Strict Covid protocols have been adhered to, which have minimized the Covid risk for us all and maximized the time that we have been able to be in school and not online. At the same time, they have strengthened our online school platform enabling our Vision - Excellence in Education to the Glory of God - to continue.

We certainly are living in uncharted times, in a world that finds itself stunned, overwhelmed and fearful. As children of the living God, we are in a very privileged position because we know the One who holds the whole world in His hands and as such we do not need to fear tomorrow. Our challenge, as His children, is to have a narrative that is different to the world around us, one of faith and hope because we know Jesus, our Lord

and Saviour. In our humanness it is easy to fall into the default position of bemoaning all that we do not have but may God help us to count our blessings every day, because when we do, we will be amazed at all that God has done.

To those in our community who have lost loved ones during this devastating time, may you experience the love and comfort of our Heavenly Father, may He be your portion every day.

As a Board of Directors, we are very aware of the fact that everyone has felt the devastating impact of the pandemic on their finances.

While the school still has to ourselves provide an excellent educational offering within the myriad of escalating costs, we have been able to limit the fee increase to below the inflation rate for the second year running. The fee increase will be 4,3%. We also know that having multiple siblings in the school is a serious drain on finances, and so we have increased the discount for two children families from R1000 to R1 200 (a 20% discount increase) and for three children families from R1600 to R1 800 (a 12.5% discount increase).

Our school also offers discount for fees paid in advance, 6% for fees paid annually in advance before the 31st January 2022. There are also discounts available for 3 month and 6 month advance payments, but these are only applicable if the account is up to date without any arrears.

The Board has continued to meet as planned this year and we celebrate God's faithfulness to us as a school as well as in our other school communities. Our hearts are filled with gratitude to Him for His provision in every area, especially for strong leadership, dedicated staff, committed parents and the precious students who have been entrusted to our care.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Christo van Staden, who ended his term with the Board of Directors this year. Over the 9 years that Christo served on the board, he seldom missed a meeting. His humility and wisdom will be missed around our table. May God continue to bless Him and his family as they seek to serve Him in all that they do.
