

THE KING'S SCHOOL & Covid-19 Vaccination



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Our school's Board of Directors and Principal recently drafted a policy to outline the school's official view with regard to Covid-19 vaccination.

In an attempt to reach a herd immunity threshold, the South African Government is aiming to vaccinate 29 million adult citizens before the end of 2021. Herd immunity will assist in avoiding many preventable COVID-19 related deaths. We at The King's School West Rand aim to work together with the South African Government in reaching the goal set to create herd immunity.

Consequently, The King's School West Rand wishes to state that we desire for all employees to be vaccinated against Covid-19 and are convinced of the effectiveness of the vaccine according to worldwide data, scientific research and findings, but we will respect the choice of those employees who do not wish to be vaccinated.

Discovery Health, the biggest medical scheme in South Africa, recently completed an extensive research project and concluded that "The evidence is unequivocal: vaccines work; are incredibly safe and reduce individual risk; and represent the most reliable route to fast-tracking our return to normality".

Their study showed that "relative to being unvaccinated, vaccination against COVID-19 with the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine:

- Reduces the risk of dying from complications of a COVID-19 infection by 94%, 14 days or more after receiving the second dose (and by 79% 14 days after receiving the first dose)
- Reduces the risk of admission to hospital following a COVID-19 infection by 92%, 14 days or more after receiving the second dose (and by 73% 14 days after receiving the first dose)
- Reduces the risk of infection by 79%, 14 days or more after receiving the second dose
- Reduces the risk of being admitted to hospital for another COVID-19 infection by 98%, for those who have recovered from a COVID-19 infection, and are vaccinated on top of this."



On a national scale, we know that a slow rate of vaccination has a devastating impact of the recovery of our economy, especially the Tourism, Entertainment and restaurant industries, and so being vaccinated can be said to be, as some church leaders have said, 'our act of love'.

Let's work together to save lives and build South Africa.

André Delpêche participated in his first CGA (Central Gauteng Aquatics) affiliated gala on the 12th of September swimming against 11 clubs. André competed in 50m Freestyle, Backstroke, Butterfly and 100m Freestyle placing 2nd, 2nd, 2nd and 3rd respectively. He received 67 points for his placings on the day. Only four weeks later on the 17th of October, André competed in his second CGA Level 1 Junior Series Gala with phenomenal results. André placed 1st in 50m Freestyle, Backstroke and Butterfly events, and placed 3rd in the 50m Breaststroke event. His placings earned him a total of 76 points. André swam faster by 4.7 seconds in the 50m Butterfly event which is outstanding considering the difficulty of the stroke.
