FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Sacrifice and the common good

On Wednesday this week, the Lent season started and will continue until 7 April (Good Friday). It is a season when the Christian family across the world willingly take part in some form of sacrifice, abstaining from something that is part of their normal routine in order to remember the ultimate sacrifice that Christ made on our behalf on the cross.

In these modern times, many Christians do not practice Lent because they believe that it pertains only to certain Christian denominations, but the reality is that Lent arose before the Christian church split into denominations. It originated around 500AD, a whole century before the Reformation.

Personally, I think that every Christian can benefit from practicing Lent because even though it might entail abstaining from something quite trivial like sugar in your coffee or giving up chocolate for 40 days, it serves to highlight that every Christ-follower is called to live a life of sacrifice in this world, so that others may benefit.

Our students are growing up in a world where sacrificing in order to contribute to the common good is foreign. The modern culture of individualism focuses on self-promotion above all, so the practice of Lent might realign some of their thinking.

As adults, I also think that small sacrifices that we subject ourselves to through Lent, can remind us of our deeply held convictions, like living sacrificially in our marriages, or carrying one another's burdens in our communities (Galatians 6:2), acts which fulfil the law of Christ.

May our Lord Jesus Christ bless you in this Lenten season, and give you new insight into your mortality, your repentance and your life in him, with accompanying joy and peace.
