

Term 1 Prayer Day 2023

We at the Kings School West Rand have committed to dedicate our "First Fruits" to God. Since it is the start of the New Year, we commit the first Term of our academic calendar, to invite God to journey with us and to seek Him and hear His prompting towards "Our First Love", which should be "Him" and from there our thoughts, our words and our actions should flow.

The Pre-School looked at "Quality of Sacrifice" in all we do. The story of "Cain and Abel" in Genesis Chapter 4 was used as a reference to remind each little one that God looks at our hearts in all we do. They learned that the way we do our school work should be worship unto God.

The Foundation Phase learned a song about the "Fruit of the Spirit". During their session they ate fruit salad whilst praying to God to help them apply the Fruit of the Spirit that they find difficult to show to others.
