

assessment is compulsory and the mark achieved with the re-submission will be taken into account the following term

In the case of Absenteeism

A doctor's certificate must be handed in on the first day back at school. Failure to do so will result in 0% for the task for the term. Learners who are absent for assessments other than tests, will still be expected to complete or submit it within 1 week of the learner's return to school.
