



# from the PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Every addiction experienced by human beings involves dependency, which is defined as "the state of relying on or being controlled by someone or something else". Our society today is characterised by a few things that encourage unhealthy dependency in children. I'd like to discuss two of these characteristics here.

The first is a parenting style called overparenting, or hovering parenting, or helicopter parenting, or sometimes lawnmower parenting. All of these involve parents completing tasks for their children which could easily be performed by the children themselves, such as carrying children's schoolbags or doing their child's project. Lawnmower parents are so named because they mow down every obstacle which would provide challenge or sustained effort.

When this parenting style is sustained, children develop dependency on such assistance and fail to develop perseverance, grit and determination required in tackling more complex tasks.

The second aspect of our society today that causes unhealthy dependency in children is the immersive technology of social media and internet gaming.

Anna Lembke, a world-leading expert on addiction, calls the smartphone the "modern-day hypodermic needle": "we turn to it for quick hits, seeking attention, validation and distraction with each swipe, like and tweet".

Lembke says that since the turn of the millennium, behavioural (as opposed to substance) addictions have soared. In certain Eastern countries there are dedicated rehab centres for the treatment of online addictions that wreak havoc in young lives.

When children continue in an obsession with social media and gaming, they become trapped in the 'immersive technology' and lose the ability to concentrate on taxing tasks for long or get into a creative flow. Such children also struggle with future planning and problem-solving.
