

I started my journey at The King's School West Rand in 2009 as the High School Physical Science teacher. That was a challenging year, as it is difficult to teach senior students without having formed a trust-relationship. There is a very wise quote that stayed with me: "Students don't care how much you know until they know how much you care." Teaching is not only about the transmission of knowledge. It's not just about writing Physics formulas or Chemical equations on the board and waiting for students to upload the knowledge. Instead, it's about taking care of the whole student - their feelings, their struggles, their search for purpose. I really enjoyed the smaller classes and the opportunity to get to know my students. I believe that there is a really unique, special bond between teachers and students at The King's School, which I had not previously experienced.

I started my teaching career in 1992 at Princess High School. From there I moved to Northcliff High School, where I taught for just over 10 impactful years. I gained valuable experience there under the excellent mentorship of the school management. I also taught at Allen Glen High School for a year, but balancing

career and family became challenging at this point. When my eldest son was almost 2 years old, I gave birth to twins. They were born 3 months prematurely, with birth weights of less than 1 kg. While on ventilators, both babies experienced bleeding on the brain and sadly our little boy passed away. My daughter, Reinetté, had some health challenges and I made the pivotal decision to leave teaching for more family time. During this time, I completed my Master's Degree through RAU. An intriguing opportunity then led me into the industry, overseeing Assessors and managing the company's financial records. I completed a Higher Certificate in Insurance and learned how to use Pastel software for bookkeeping.

In 2008, Mr Langley invited me to come and visit the school and I started to feel my heart being tugged towards teaching again. I knew that it was time for me to return to what I have been called to. At The King's School I was able to rekindle my passion for teaching Physical Science and integrate it with a Biblical Worldview, which greatly influences one's teaching philosophy and shapes your interactions with students, colleagues and parents.

My children also attended The King's School West Rand from Grades 6 and 8 respectively. I am very grateful for how the school prepared them for life. Not only did they soar academically after school, but they are also well-grounded and resilient young adults. My son, Jaco, qualified as an Electrical & Electronic Engineer through UJ, has a fulfilling job, and recently got engaged to Melita, also a past student of The King's School. My daughter obtained a BEd Foundation Phase degree through NWU and is currently furthering her studies in Psychology.

I met my husband, Hennie, while both our sons were part of The King's School's Shell Eco Marathon team. We got married in 2016 and I gained another son, Humarno, whom, I am very proud to say, is also now my colleague in the Physical Sciences Department. My husband's enthusiasm for cycling rubbed off on me and for a while we were avid cyclists. I very much enjoy watching events like the Tour De France, the Giro d'Italia and the Vuelta and I hope to travel and experience those countries with my husband in the future.

I am grateful for the journey so far, for God's providence and the support of the school community. I am excited to see what God has planned for the school's future. I believe that, like Ester, we can also trust God as we live out our "for a time such as this" each day, right where we have been called to be.
