Psalm 133 says "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity". I am always reminded of this verse when we have events like what happened last Saturday. Because Christian community is God's idea, there is something beyond the natural that happens when his beloved gather together. God is present there and in his presence there is fullness of joy.

Of course we've also all experienced that in Christian community there will always be people that annoy or irritate you. But God calls us to community. He achieves his purposes through community. He makes us whole through community.

Dietrich Bonhoeffer said people enter relationships with their own particular ideals and dreams of what community should look like. In 'Life together' he wrote these surprising words: "But God's grace quickly frustrates all such dreams. A great disillusionment with others, with

Christians in general, and, if we are fortunate, with ourselves, is bound to overwhelm us as surely as God desires to lead us to an understanding of genuine Christian community ... the sooner this moment of disillusionment comes over the individual and the community, the better for both Those who love their dream of Christian community more than the Christian community itself become destroyers of that Christian community even though their personal intentions may be ever so honest, earnest, and sacrificial."

Managing our expectations in Christian community is obviously important. There's an old saying that says, "you can choose your friends, but you can't choose your family". How true about Christian family. God calls people of all tribes and nations, people and languages (Revelation 5) and binds them together in love. Our job is to "make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4).

Thank you to everyone who gathered on Saturday, it was great fun. Good and pleasant.
