From the Deputy PRINCIPAL

There was always a strong faith present in my family, particularly in my grandmother and mom. As a young grade 6 learner, I sold dried fruit and fresh strawberries and bought my first, leather-bound Bible from the proceeds. A relationship with God seemed like such an obvious decision. However, during my early teen years I guickly drifted away from the Lord and the world sucked me in completely. There were glimpses of hope through the years, but my life was a mess. During High School, I irregularly attended Youth, just enough to keep up appearances and people "off my back". At the age of 21, with a 2-year-old son who didn't really see much of me, I remember crying out in absolute desperation to God. "This cannot be the life You want for me! Help!"

Four months later, God orchestrated some drastic life changes and I was back home, seeing my son more regularly and studying the Bible with a campus ministry at the University of Pretoria while completing my BCom degree.

During this time, I met my wife, Antoinette, who had graduated as a teacher but had chosen instead to pursue full-time work with the teens and students of our Church. I was offered a Youth Pastor position at the same church, leading to Antoinette and I getting married. We felt for some time that God was prompting us to make a change, so Antoinette continued her teaching career while I pursued a career in the business world.

I guickly realised that I could not find joy in what I do without it involving ministry with children, so I started my teaching career while doing my PGCE. After being retrenched on a last-in-first-out basis from my second school, I thought that I had made a mistake. It was that November that Annemarie Russel hosted the Gauteng ACSI Principal's Christmas function and the Principal of Vineyard was sitting next to the husband of a teacher I worked with. God had orchestrated this perfectly and I was invited to an interview at Vineyard. We prayed and felt that Vineyard Christian School (now The King's School Vineyard) was exactly where God wanted me. I quickly saw how my ministry experience, my (unused) BCom and teaching all came together and my journey in Christian education started. My time at Vineyard, ACSI and now at The King's School West Rand has been some of the most blessed and fulfilling times of my life. Our two youngest both attended Vineyard and West Rand, with our youngest currently in grade 11.



There are few things in life that I am as sure of as the power of Christian education to transform the lives of young people and change our world. I am honoured to work alongside like-minded staff and families at The King's School as we plant seeds in the lives of the young people God has entrusted to our care. May God guide and give us wisdom as educators and parents to sow generously.




High School News >> THOUGHTS
