From the PRINCIPAL'S DESK

A life of *surrender*

As Christ followers we are repeatedly exhorted to a life of sacrifice. This is really hard to think about and so much harder to do. For our kids, it's even more difficult because this world leads us in ways of self-enrichment and success defined in the accumulation of wealth and possessions. What does it take to declare "My life is not my own, I belong to another"?

To embrace Jesus Christ, not only as Saviour, but as the Lord of my life. New Testament apostle Paul starts several of his letters with "Paul, a slave of Christ Jesus..." because he knew this life of total commitment and relished it. Our modern translations have softened the word 'slave' to 'servant', but personally I like the concept of being a slave to Christ, a complete submission to his Lord-ship and to the good, perfect and pleasing will of God. Yielding to the Lordship of Christ is not necessarily a decision that is a fait accompli, but requires a daily surrender of self and a recommitment to his way.

All of us can start each day with the prayer, "Lord here I am, your slave, what would you have me do?" and know that it will always be with a heart of repentance, because of our fallibility. As we raise sons and daughters, a great way to teach (and model) a life of sacrifice is to start by serving others. Let us daily show our children the responsive obedience to Christ our Lord by serving others, and knowing the joy that comes with walking in Union with him.
